Dear friends,

I would like to begin this editorial by remembering a great man, an important FIAP Master, a dear friend of FIAP and a distinguished FIAP Vice President who, for years, attracted the affection and esteem of all the Members of our large family with his charisma - Jacques Denis, FIAP Hon. Vice-President - MFIAP, HonEFIAP.

Jacques left us the day before his hundredth birthday, taking with him the love of thousands of people who were fortunate enough to know him. As a longtime member of the FIAP Board, he always represented, with his calm and conciliatory temperament, a guiding balance to whom we all looked up with respect and admiration. Farewell great friend; may the earth rest lightly upon you.

I must draw everyone's attention to a matter of great importance: the "1st Universities & Academies

Photographic World Cup". This event arose from the pressing and justified request of many Federations and clubs to engage in specific projects for young people who, while representing our future, are increasingly scarce in our ranks, as in those of the main international photographic organizations.





The competition required extensive and challenging planning and the search for partners to support this ambitious project. The FIAP Photo Academy Training took on the project, and I presented the initial draft to the FIAP Congress in Asturias (Spain) in December 2022. Again in October 2023, we revisited the project during the General Assembly in Armenia. Added to this are the numerous references to the project in the pages of FIAP NEWS, culminating in the publication of the final announcement last May.

Given all the effort and anticipation, we expected a significant response from all FIAP members, as the competition was aimed **not only at Universities but also at Academies and Photography Schools in general**.

However, we received photos from only 17 of the 120 FIAP member countries, which is quite surprising! It is true that this is the first edition, and the competition can and must be improved in the future, thanks to your valuable suggestions, but now we absolutely need your support to ensure that all our efforts have not been in vain.

The competition deadline has been extended until August 18, so I urge you to do everything possible to make this initiative aimed at our young people a great and important success. Please send the announcement as quickly as possible to all Universities, Academies, and Photography Schools, encouraging them not to miss this very important opportunity.



Allow me to remind you once again of the important prizes for the top three (3) winners:

- Free stay in China from October 9 to 21, including international flight, domestic transfers, accommodation, and full board.
- Participation in:
 - o Lishui Photography Symposium
 - o Awards Ceremony in Jinan
 - o Awards Ceremony at the Olympic Towers in Beijing
 - o Photo Beijing 2024, one of the largest photographic events in the world.
- A one-day workshop in Jinan with world famous photographers:
 - o Manoocher Deghati (https://manoocherphoto.wordpress.com/)
 - o Tom Ang (https://tomang.com)
- Three cameras worth \$3,000, \$2,000, and \$1,000 respectively.
- Exhibition of a portfolio of 15 images for each winner during the Awards Ceremony in Jinan.
- Exhibition of a portfolio of 15 images for each winner throughout 2025 in all 27 FIAP Exhibition Centers, with an additional 5 centers opening in 2025.
- Moreover, the top three (3) ranked Universities, Academies, or Photography Schools (ranked by the sum of scores of the photos submitted by 5 students) will have their Dean or Director invited to China from October 9 to 21, with all expenses covered (including international flight, domestic transfers, accommodation, and full board).
- Please note that to participate in the contest, each University, Academy, or Photography School must select 5 students not older than 25 years (born after June 30, 1999) and directly upload their data and pictures (a maximum of 4 photos per author).

This significant event is organized by our friend Barun Sinha, Liaison Officer of India, whom I thank again for his excellent work and I am sure it will offer unique and magnificent photographic opportunities.

As of June 1, I will be the new Director of the FIAP Distinctions Service.

Some of you may know me because I have been the Director of the Collection Service for more than 7 years. I also assisted the Distinctions Service, being the person who informed FIAP Liaison Officers of the issues that required rectification in their nation's applications for FIAP Distinctions.

For the time being, little will change in the operation of the Distinctions Service. Regulations document 011/2016 details the current requirements for FIAP Distinctions. This includes a requirement for AFIAP and EFIAP applicants to gain a number of acceptances with prints in print sections of salons.

I would like to thank my predecessor Freddy Van Gilbergen for his confidence in me and the FIAP Board that agreed and entrusted me with this role.

Reintroduction of the Youth Photographers Gallery Section in FIAP News

Dear FIAP Community,

lampleased to announce the reintroduction of the Youth Photographers Gallery section in FIAP News, starting with the December 2024 edition. This section will showcase the work of young photographers, providing a platform for their talent and creativity. Any photographer who is under 25 years of age is invited to send photos they have produced for possible inclusion in this gallery. Photos being sent will need to be submitted by the closing date that applies to each edition of FIAP News as shown in the rear of the magazine. Details regarding sending photos to this section of FIAP News are as follows and this same information will also be available on an ongoing basis at the rear of each edition of FIAP News.

Submission of Photos for the Youth Photographers Gallery

- 1. Photographer must be under 25 years of age as of the closing date for the FIAP News edition to which the photos are being submitted.
- Ahmed Albusaidi
- 2. Each photographer may submit a maximum of 3 photos.
- 3. Photos are to be 1024pixels on the longest dimension, 96ppi, sRGB colour space and saved as the highest quality jpgs.
- 4. There is no set subject. Images can be colour or monochrome.
- 5. Strictly no nude photography.
- 6. All components of the final photo, and modifications of the final photo, must be the work of the photographer, eg no clipart, no other person to work on the photo, no photos that have Al created components.
- 7. Photographers under the age of 18 must have the consent of their parent or legal guardian to send photographs for possible publication in FIAP News.
- 8. Photographers must send the following with the photographs.
 - a. Photographer's name.
 - b. Photographer's date of birth and age as of the closing date for the FIAP News edition.
 - c. The country in which the photographer resides.
 - d. A title for each photo or short text about the photo (35 words maximum).
 - e. If the photographer is under 18 years of age, an "Author's Agreement Form for Minors", signed by a parent or legal guardian, must be sent.
 - f. Photographers who are 18 years of age or older must sign and submit the adult "Author's Agreement Form".
- 9. Ensure that where any recognisable people are featured in the photos, that they (or their parent/guardian, if they are under 18) have given their permission for the photo to be published in FIAP News. Please read the FIAP News Regulations before signing the Author's Agreement Form.
- 10. The "Author's Agreement Forms", and the FIAP News Regulations to which these forms apply, can be downloaded via https://www.fiap.net/en/services/fiap-news-service
- 11. The photos, plus the required information and the applicable Authors Agreement form, must be sent to the Director of FIAP News using the file transfer service: https://wetransfer.com/. The email address to which the transfer should be directed is fiapnewsdirector@gmail.com.
- 12. Any questions regarding submission of images for this section should be sent to the FIAP News Director at fiapnewsdirector@gmail.com

This is not a competition. There will however be a selection made to ideally show photographs from photographers of different ages and from different countries. Technical image quality will be a consideration, but the concepts and composition will be prioritised as appropriate for the photographers age. The photographers name, age, country and the title of the photo (or text, as per point 8.d above, if provided) will be published with the selected photos.

In May this year, a person held in great esteem in the history of Belgian Photography, and also in the history of the FIAP, Jacques Denis, disappeared from us one day before his hundredth birthday.

Writing a text about someone who has been at the service of photography all his life is a difficult assignment for

me, but I will give a brief summary of his role in photography. I will limit myself to three major achievements in his photographic career.

The first is his chairmanship of the Belgian Federation of Photo Circles, which came to an end when the culture department was split into a French and Flemish department around the 1980s. He subsequently served as chairman of the umbrella organization, namely the Belgian Federation of Photographers, a role in which he built more awareness of and involvement with FIAP.

Under his leadership, a FIAP Congress was organized in Belgium in 1989 with great success. This event allowed the participants of this 20th FIAP Congress to explore the most beautiful places in Belgium. Organizing such a conference is no longer possible for our Belgian Federation.

The second important achievement was the start of a long career within the FIAP, one which started prior to 1979 with him setting up the AV Service of FIAP and later saw him join the FIAP Executive Board in 1997 at the Congress in Shenzhen, China as the FIAP Vice President. He remained a Vice President of FIAP until his retirement at the Congress in Hanoi, Vietnam, in 2010.

Jacques was the person who liked to make compromises and calm people down. Together with his wife Andreé Denis, they formed the FIAP couple par excellence and the FIAP Collections Service was founded. Many photos from the Distinctions Service

were selected at the Denis' home by a five-member jury and the most beautiful photos were handed by him and his wife to the Museum of Lausanne. They continued this task until his 85th birthday.

His love for audiovisual productions prompted him to set up an Audiovisual Service within both Belgium and also for FIAP. He was FIAP Director of this Service from some time prior to 1979 until 2010. He set up Salon Patronage for AV salons and FIAP Distinctions for Audio Visuals makers during these years, all of which are still active.

A third part of his photographic career was the chairmanship of the Royal Mechelen Photo Circle, a club known all over the world for the biennial audiovisual festival that took place over a period of 2 weeks in Mechelen. The preselections and judging by well-known diaporamists from all over the world took place in the Denis family's living room. A large screen and the necessary slide projectors and sound system were set up in the living room for a period of at least a week. He was also responsible for editing, compiling and sending the well-known club magazine "Brandpunt" to many people, not only his club members but also all the people he knew.

In addition to his love for photography, Jacques had another hobby; listening to classical music, which he enjoyed and went to numerous concerts with his wife. This preference for classical music was also reflected in his slide programs.

In recent years he has devoted a lot of time and energy to his grandchildren and great-grandchildren, his favourite pastime, especially if they were interested in photography or music.

In 1985 Jacques received the MFIAP with a portfolio on life in the Paris metro. In 1976 he was awarded the HonEFIAP and in 2010, Honorary Vice President of FIAP was conferred upon him.

FIAP Best Author of a Salon FIAP Best of the Best of the Year

To honour the most successful and loyal participants in FIAP salons, in 2010 the FIAP board decided to introduce a new award, which is attributed to the best entrant of each salon, and a new annual title based on this award.

Each salon determines a "FIAP Best Author" title to whom a FIAP special light blue pin is awarded. This pin is delivered to the salon free of charge and the salon awards it to the salon entrant who has achieved the highest number of acceptances across all the sections of the salon added together. In the event of a tie, the salon organiser irrevocably decides the winner, taking awards into consideration.

Over the period of each year, from the 1st January to 31st December, Mr Francis Nicoll from the FIAP Salon File Department maintains a tally to determine who has achieved the highest number of FIAP Best Author titles for the year.

The winning photographer is then invited to the next FIAP Congress where they will be honoured in a special "Best of the Best" (BOB) ceremony. A trophy is presented to this BOB photographer at this ceremony.

The FIAP Salon File Department works closely with the FIAP Ethics Service, that is under the watchful eye of Mr. Pierluigi Rizzato, to make sure that the winners have thoroughly respected the salon participation rules, especially regarding the conformity of photographs to the FIAP Nature definition. Sadly, nearly every year, contestants reluctant to play according to the rules had to be eliminated from the ranking lists.

István Kerekes EFIAP/d3 FIAP Best of the Best Winner for 2023

Photography is an essential part of my life.

I was born in 1977. My qualification is physical education teacher. Having worked in that profession for twenty-two years, since 2022 photography has become my profession, and I have been working as a freelance photojournalist for two years.

I started photography almost thirty years ago, taking photos as a hobby for a very long time.

I entered my first FIAP competition in 2000, when I was twenty-three years old.

For me, participating in FIAP's photo competitions is a real challenge, as winning prizes in these competitions means that your work is recognized. I currently have close to five thousand awards in photo contests, the most of any Hungarian photographer.

Since 2012, I have been continuously participating in international photo contests as a jury member or as jury president.

A major achievement in my life was when, in 2012, I was the first Hungarian (and the thirty-ninth in the world) to receive the EFIAP/platinum distinction. Then in 2018 I was able to take the EFIAP/d3 distinction, only the fifth in the world to do so – and I was the youngest photographer in the world to receive these two distinctions.

My favorite photo subjects are people, portraiture, photojournalism, sports, travel, landscape, nature. Through my photos, I present emotions, destinies, special non-ordinary faces, diversity of ethnicities, the wonder of movement, unique holidays, wonders of nature, fascinating landscapes.

The fact that I have won the "Best Author of Salon" in various competitions is a great honor. To do so, you must photograph several subjects well and have a good understanding of them.

Receiving the "Best of the Best" award is a momentous occasion and an achievement that I consider the pinnacle of my photographic career, as it is a world championship title.

I am acutely aware of the calibre of talent that exists within the FIAP community, and to be recognized among such esteemed peers is a privilege beyond measure. It fills me with both joy and a profound sense of gratitude.

The award is a validation of the countless hours of dedication, creativity, and passion that I have poured into my craft over the years. It is also a powerful affirmation of my artistic vision and a testament to the boundless possibilities of photographic expression.

I am deeply grateful for the support and encouragement I have received throughout my journey as a photographer, My Best of the Best award encourages me to continue this journey; it serves as both a milestone and an inspiration, motivating me to strive for excellence in all that I do. I am committed to pushing the boundaries of creativity and innovation in my work, and to present the world, and the interesting and sensitive details of the people living in it, through photography.



22nd FIAP Nature Biennial, Germany 2024

22nd FIAP Nature Biennial Germany 2024





In 2024 the 22nd FIAP Nature Biennial was organised in Germany. The FIAP Operational Member for Germany is the "**Deutscher Verband für Fotografie**" (DVF).

The judging was completed on the 6th July in the city of Filderstadt. The judges were: Romain Nero, EFIAP/g, HonEFIAP (Luxembourg), Jef Lemmens, ESFIAP, EFIAP/d3 (Belgium) and Howard Tate, ARPS, AFIAP, HonPAGB (England). The whole process has been efficiently managed by Norbert and Karin Heil.

We are very grateful to all the participants of this Biennial. Collections were sent by 33 countries, and we received 874 photographs in total between the two sections.

The judging of the collections for each section was done in two steps:

- 1) the judging of each work of the collection
- 2) the judging of the coherence of the collection

The total score of a collection was obtained by the addition of the points from the two different judgements.

The print section had 24 countries participate. The winner of the World Cup was Italy. The medal winning countries were France, Ireland and Luxembourg. The HM's were obtained by Argentina, Great Britain, India, Germany, Russian federation and Norway.

The digital section received collections from 32 countries. The winner of the World Cup was Canada. The medal winning countries were Great Britain, France and Belgium. The HM's were obtained by Ireland, Luxembourg, Italy, Argentina, South Africa and India.

France obtained the Great Prize, Nature Trophy "Odette Bretscher".

Mrs. Odette Bretscher created this prize in 1985, at the moment of leaving the presidency of FIAP. The prize rewards the country that is best placed in the combination of the two sections of the Nature Biennial.

Other than the awards for the winning country teams, eleven individual awards, six FIAP medals and five awards offered by the DVF, were given in each section to the top photographs.




FIAP Photo Academy Online Events Service

Arco Gaiotti joined us on Friday 23rd February for his second presentation, this one on the theme of "Photography in Shrinking Natural Habitats". And, as before, it was an excellent and very thought provoking presentation.



In 2009 he spent a month in Alaska to observe the fauna and the spectacular local landscapes, in complete autonomy, camping in the wilderness. From this experience the desire to give a more professional tone to his passion for photography grew.

In the fall of 2013 he participated in an expedition to the Svalbard Islands, a few days before

the Arctic night. The results of this photographic adventure are translated into publications in the most important international newspapers, including a double page print in the paper edition of 'The Guardian'.

He has been honoured with numerous awards in the main international nature photography competitions, including: The SONY WPA (Open



Shortlist), Nature's Best, Windland Smith Rice International Awards and Memorial Maria Luisa. Other awards were obtained at Asferico, GDT European Photographer of the Year, Montphoto, Oasis, Glanzlichter, SIPA, Nature Photographer of the year and Global Arctic Awards.

Marco loves unspoiled natural landscapes. In his landscapes he subtly gives way to different animal species such as polar bears, walruses, arctic foxes and seals. His photos are distinguished by the magical soft lights that illuminate the landscape or because of dramatic skies. Marco's images are in any case a feast for the eyes.













Wednesday 1st May saw a wonderful presentation on Documentary Photography by the UK photographer Martin Parr, one of the best-known documentary photographers of his generation. With over 100 books of his own published, and another 30 which he has edited, his photographic legacy is already established.

During his presentation Martin showed us some of his well-known and, perhaps, not so wellknown images. He explained how he started in photography and what motivates him to capture and record the British people as they go about their daily lives.

Martin is a chronicler of our age. In the face of the constantly growing flood of images released by the media, his photographs offer us the opportunity to see the world from his unique perspective.

At first glance, his photographs seem exaggerated or even grotesque. The motifs he chooses are strange, the colours are garish and the perspectives are unusual. His term for the overwhelming power of published images is "propaganda". He counters this propaganda with his own chosen weapons: criticism, seduction and humour. As a result, his photographs are original and

entertaining, accessible and understandable. But at the same time they show us in a penetrating way how we live, how we present ourselves to others, and what we value.

Martin also acts as a photographic curator. He has curated two photography festivals - Arles in 2004 and the Brighton Biennial in 2010. More recently, Martin curated the Barbican exhibition "Strange and Familiar".

He has been a member of

the Magnum agency since 1994 and was its President from 2013 - 2017. And in 2013 Martin was appointed the visiting professor of photography at the University of Ulster.



The presentation focused on Richard's career as a travel photographer including getting started, selling stock, setting up Lonely Planet Images, photo tours and publishing. It included a selection of images to illustrate what, why and how he shoots.

Richard's images are published worldwide in books, magazines, newspapers, brochures, calendars, posters, cards and websites. He has published thirteen books including five editions of the best-selling Lonely Planet Guide to Travel Photography, and books on large format pictorials and books about photographic experiences and encounters in Australia, Nepal and India.

Richard was one of five photographers selected for the first series of the National Geographic Channel television series Tales by Light (now showing on Netflix). He is a Master of Photography awarded by the Australian Institute of Professional Photography (AIPP), an Ambassador for the Australian Himalayan Foundation and represents Canon Australia as a Canon Master Photographer.

He also runs workshops teaching all aspects of travel photography for individuals and small groups and leads photography tours to Australian and international destinations. He is also much sought after as a speaker and judge for photography and travel industry events and competitions.

His photography is represented by Getty Images and AWL Images. When he's not on the road he lives in Sydney, Australia.

After the ceremony, we had a discussion with FIAP President Riccardo Busi, moderated by Sille Sanat Sarayı President Reha Bilir.



- A list of the image files must be provided with any applicable text that is to accompany each image, eg who and what is shown in photo. This list can either be at the bottom of the article or provided in a separate document.
- Images must be of a good quality and edited for best presentation, eg colour, cropping etc.
- If the position or order of the photos in your article is important, please put the file name in red text between paragraaphs in your article and we will endeavour to place it there. Depending on page layout, it may not always be possible to place the photo exactly where you would like it.



For the 2024 editions, in July and December, the following temporary arrangements apply:

- There won't be an Affiliates Section, Articles section or Recommendations section.
- The FIAP Exhibition Centres section in the July edition will just have news of the opening of new exhibition centres, plus one other pre-approved article.
- The FIAP Exhibition Centres section will resume in full in the December edition.

Submission of Articles

All those submitting items to FIAP News for possible publication must ensure they have read the Regulation for Publishing Articles in FIAP News – Doc 032 / 2021. All articles submitted for possible publication must be accompanied by the relevant "FIAP News Author's Agreement" form that has been completed and signed by the author of the items or the parent/guardian of the author if the author is under the age of 18.
